- The legal basis for processing this data is that it is necessary for our legitimate interest, namely for the purpose of ensuring that the process, analysis and reporting for consultation is accurate and comprehensive. In addition to the specific purposes for which we may process your personal data set out above, we may also process any of your personal data where such processing is necessary for compliance with a legal obligation to which we are subject.

We may share this information with:

The contractors and sub-contractors that are supporting Boom Power on this Project and our consultation, relevant governmental bodies such as the Planning Inspectorate and the Department for Energy Security and Net Zero, and our insurers and professional advisors insofar as reasonably necessary for the purposes of obtaining and maintaining insurance cover, managing risks, obtaining professional advice and managing legal disputes.

How do we protect data?

When we engage suppliers and partners to process data on our behalf, we do so based on written instructions, ensuring the third party has implemented appropriate technical and organisational measures to ensure the security of data. In all circumstances, we will ensure that the data is protected and transferred in a manner consistent with applicable data protection laws.

How long do we retain data?

We will only retain data that we process for any purpose for as long as necessary to fulfil the purpose for which it was collected. Unless we contact you and obtain your consent for us to retain your personal data for a longer period, we will delete your personal data as soon as practicable following the outcome of the consultation process. We may retain your personal data where such retention is necessary for compliance with a legal obligation to which we are subject.

What information do we collect when you visit this Website and how is it used?

When someone visits this Website, we collect standard internet log information and details of visitor behaviour patterns to find out things such as the number of visitors to various parts of the Website.

We collect this information in a way which does not identify individuals and we do not make any attempt to find out the identities of those visiting. We will not associate any data gathered from this site with any personally identifying information from any source. If we do want to collect personally identifiable information through the Website, we will highlight this in advance. We will make it clear when we collect personal data and will explain what we intend to do with it.
